2.1 Glenfinnan 07

This programme of events will be coming to an end shortly. The Beginners Gaelic class and the music lessons are finishing early December. Eileen has approached Feis nan Garbh Criochan about continuing the music lessons and they will discuss it at their committee meeting. The ceardcall còmhradh will continue until March and the photography project will be completed by next spring. There has been great support from within and outwith the village. We have had some very well attended events such as the family ceilidh in February; Glenfinnan's Big Paint; Gaelic for gamekeepers, poachers and hillwalkers; the family ceilidh dance in July and An evening with Charlie MacFarlane. On 8th December we are hosting a Grand Finale family ceilidh in the Princes House Hotel.

- Ingrid Henderson raised the issue of phones – landlines and mobiles. The BT junction boxes are in a bad state and the lines are poor e.g. many people sound very distant to people phoning them. Broadband speeds are slow and at times people cannot get online because they are so slow. There are new houses being built and new businesses in the village. Ingrid declared her vested interest. The main point is that BT will not upgrade the exchange unless everyone complains. Re mobile phones there are problems with ‘network busy’ so people cannot make or receive calls and lengthy delays in text deliveries. The seriousness of this issue was apparent recently when communication problems hampered a rescue operation involving people stranded on the loch. Ingrid volunteered to write a letter to the village asking everyone to complain in the hope that these problems will then be resolved.
